Redfield has completed the Integrated Pest Management (IPM) certification training and passed the written portion of the MNLA Certified Plant Professional (CPP) exam. She received a



Montana State University System Honors Scholarship, served as Park Future Farmers of America (FFA) Chapter Secretary and President, and received 2nd Place in the State FFA Agronomy Contest. She has also served as a Teacher's Assistant (TA) at Montana State University in the herbaceous ornamentals class and will serve as a TA in woody ornamentals this fall.

Jodi Redfield was raised on a working cattle ranch in Paradise Valley in a rich agricultural environment near Pray, Montana. She looks forward to putting her passion for and knowledge of plants to work in the horticultural industry, with plans to remain in the Bozeman area working in landscape design.

The Montana Nursery & Landscape Association annually presents scholarship awards to students who demonstrate both academic excellence and a commitment to horticulture in Montana. Scholarship awards are also offered by MNLA to Association members pursuing additional learning or certification in
